HELLO FROM CANON WILLIAM

Dear Friends,

Back in the Middle Ages the duties of Kings in this Country included leading armies into battle. Many battles were lost and some lost their lives as well. Sometimes fighting was to protect their country but at other times it was to gain more land.

Things have changed significantly since then and there is now a constitutional monarchy with very different responsibilities and duties. These duties include serving the Country and Commonwealth and come before all else, including their family.

I recently read an article describing this. The month after the Queen's death last year Princess Anne was in Uganda, Royal duties were continuing as normal. Amongst places she visited one was a refugee camp to support and encourage the work there being done to enable the people to be self-sustaining. This is the sort of work that she, along with rest of the working Royal Family, do day by day. At his first Address to the Nation, King Charles pledged to continue the work that his Mother had done during her reign.

But there is more to leadership than this. I had an opportunity of seeing this when I was the Diocesan Rural Officer and we were invited to (the then Prince) Charles' house at Highgrove. We were there to see his farm and his policy on how to tend the various crops. Like his Father, Charles has a major concern for the environment in the world and the consequent effects it can have on climate change. Part of this was to make the farm totally organic. Although I do not fully appreciate the science behind this, one can see both a concern he has for these issues and the determination to contribute making a more sustainable world.

This has helped me to appreciate more of the issues our King has a passion for and that he has a vision that is far bigger than simply doing just his basic duties as a constitutional monarch.

The working Royal Family is following the example of the service that Christ shows – that he was here to serve, not to be served. This is done, serving us all, both quietly and conscientiously.

With Charles' Coronation now imminent, it is a good time to remind ourselves of the nature of true leadership. The King needs our prayers and support as he affirms his life of service. We pray that the Christian faith will help him as King in the same way we ask that our faith will continue to sustain us.

BEESTON REGIS

First Community Breakfast Held! — On Mothering Sunday, the Refreshment Team hosted the first free Community Breakfast at All Saints! Scheduled for 10.15am, prior to the Children's & Family Service at 11.00am, it sought to attract newcomers, young ones plus their adults, families experiencing food poverty and those in our community who might not be familiar with church. At the moment, in the absence of cooking facilities apart from a toaster and microwave, our breakfast items were, in the main, served cold. However, fruit salad, muesli, yogurts, toast, pastries and hot drinks were warmly received and generated a real buzz of friendly chatter. More people came than expected to this leap of faith which was such an answer to prayer. Amongst the number were 2 new families, one of which said afterwards: "It was just gorgeous....Feel lucky to have such a lovey welcoming church". The Churchwardens elect are committed to arranging further Community Breakfasts, perhaps in conjunction with future Children's & Family services.

Our **Children's & Family Services** are now attracting new young ones. Since September 2022, our 3rd Sunday of the month "Service of the Word" has put children and families at its centre. Advertising and promotion of such has begun, albeit in a small way, but it is now regular. At every service, since the launch, a child has been present (though only one), until both March and April when 2 families and 3 children took part. With the little ones absorbed in arts & crafts in our Children's Corner, rattling and shaking musical instruments to worship songs, handing out flower posies, collecting up hymn books and responding to the storytelling by the Rector, our Children's & Family services are proving to be very joyful and exuberant occasions! LOCAL NEWS

Sheringham and District Philatelic Society — We were pleased to welcome one new member at our April meeting, and a couple who came to see whether or not they would like to join us. We very much hope that we will see them again in May!

Six members presented a tremendous variety of mainly 10 sheet displays. Mike Clarke, a lifetime GB collector, brought along a selection of surface printed, Victorian stamps on covers, which had recently taken his interest. Tony Taylor put up part of an old competition entry of his, of Queen Elizabeth II 3d Wildings. There were blocks, booklet panes, watermark variations and printing errors amongst them.

Jane Purkiss has always taken a great interest in anything philatelic relating to Captain James Cook and, this time, she showed us her collection of Cook Island stamps, some dating back to 1893. Early stamps were overprinted New Zealand stamps, before these 15 islands in the South Pacific, became self-governing.

Tim Harvey's interest is more in his postcard collection, and he displayed a wonderful group of cards which demonstrated the growth of Cromer as a tourist destination. In the early days, Cromer was known as The Gentlemen's Watering Hole – a place where the wealthy came for sea air. With the arrival of the railways and the publication of Clement Scott's poem, The Garden of Sleep, Cromer's popularity grew. Postcards were produced illustrating all aspects of this glorious seaside town.

Andrew McCandlish brought the evening to a close with stamps from Azerbaijan, Poland in exile in WW2 and Albania, giving us the fascinating historical details which lay behind these stamps.
