Dear Friends,

November is the month when we both look back and forward. We look back because November is the month when we do a lot of Remembering. As the days shorten and darkness seems to be a greater feature than sunshine over our British world, we think back and remember.

Firstly, through our All Souls Service, we remember all those who have died and whose memories we hold dear. As I am sure you all know, during the service we read out the names of all those who have died within the last year and any others who we have been asked to remember, and then after all the names have been read out, friends and relatives of the people we have named will be invited to come forward and light a candle in their memory.

Our service this year will be taking place on Sunday 5th November at 3.00pm at Holy Trinity Church, West Runton. If you would like the name of any of your loved ones to be included in our commemoration, please write their names on one of the lists at the back of the five churches or let me or Pam know, and please feel free to join us at the service.

Then on Remembrance Sunday, 12th November, we remember those who have fallen (and are still falling) in war zones, with a renewed determination to bring an end to death, maiming, and mental health problems that come from war, with a special Act of Remembrance in each of our churches, details of which can be found later in this Newsletter.

But added to these remembrances, we also remember those we continue to love and care for as we prepare for Christmas – who will we send a card to, or prepare a present for? So we remember the living as well – those who are close to us and those who are further away and perhaps we haven't seen for a long time.

We treasure our memories of people – both the living and those who are no longer with us physically. November is definitely a time for Remembrance in more ways than one! For the past and for the future, we determine not to take our family and friends for granted, but to treasure them. To remember them.

Looking forward from remembrance, on the first Sunday in December (3rd December) we arrive at Advent Sunday, a time of preparation as we move towards celebrating the birth of Jesus on Christmas day.

In the Christian church, a candle is lit for each Sunday in Advent as we prepare for the joy of Jesus' birth and remember all that he did for us, in coming to earth as a human being. It is something we should not take for granted.

And so in our remembrances this month let us also take time to include Jesus, giving thanks for all that he had done for us, and still does for us, through the work of the Holy Spirit.

Sheringham and District Philatelic Society — Ten members gathered on Monday 9th October to enjoy a philatelic trip around the multitude of Greek islands. Peter Boyce, from the Norfolk and Norwich Philatelic Society, put on a superb display of stamps and covers, covering the earliest issues until the eventual union of the island groups with Greece. The strategic situation of the islands has meant that most of them have been taken over by foreign powers at some time or other. Each administration either issued their own stamps or overprinted existing stock. Crete, for example, was divided into 4 parts at the end of the 19th century and was governed by Italy, Russia, France and Britain! Peter's great knowledge and interest in this subject stems from the time when he lived and worked in Greece.

The next meeting of the Society is on **Monday 13th November at 7.30pm** at **West Runton Church Hall** when we will be holding our annual **Quiz Night**. Visitors are most welcome.

Priscilla Bacon Lent Appeal Update — The Bishop's Lent Appeal 2023 was launched to raise money for the new Priscilla Bacon Lodge hospice building.
