HELLO FROM JEREMY

Dear Friends,

As I write Summer rapidly has become Autumn almost overnight, but I hope you all had a good Summer and were able to get some time to relax.

I was thinking the other day how very small actions are often very significant: a smile, a wave or greeting, the note or phone call of thanks, giving encouragement or showing concern, they can make such a difference to the recipient. But it is all too easy to omit them – I know I am sometimes as guilty as the next person on this.

But Jesus was someone who saw things which other people missed or thought unimportant. He saw and valued the woman who put an apparently insignificant coin in the Temple offering. He told parables about small mustard seeds and a lost coin; accepted the gift of a young boy's lunch to feed a huge crowd; mixed with people who were regarded as rubbish by the respectable religious; said that those who helped people in need who were easily ignored or overlooked were helping him – and that those who failed to help them failed him.

It is one of the many challenges that Jesus gives to those of any age who seek to follow him. As in the popular saying, so often, 'actions speak louder than words'. St Francis, one of my favorite Saints, understood this, he said 'share the Gospel in all that you do and, if necessary, use words'.

DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION

A Message from Jeremy

At our recent Ministry Team meeting we had a very long discussion about the ongoing distribution of Communion within the Benefice, as we are now somewhat unique in still wearing face coverings and giving communion in only one kind.

What we are proposing is that from Sunday 1st October we will go back to the precovid system of having the priest distributing the bread and a communion assistant offering the chalice.

However, we want to stress that if anyone feels uncomfortable receiving the wine they do not have to, and it is still a full communion if only the bread is consumed.

Also, we do not want communicants to intinct their own wafers in the wine, as in studies from a hygiene perspective this has the potential to spread far more germs than sharing a common cup.

If, at the end of communion, any of the Clergy feel uncomfortable with consuming the wine from the chalice after it has been shared by members of the congregation, it is theologically acceptable to pour the remains of the wine to the ground, either using the piscina in the churches that have one or pouring it to ground outside somewhere on the consecrated land.

I have also requested that if any members of the Ministry Team (or servers) contract a cold, and cannot find someone to take their place, they should wear a face covering when they come anywhere near the communion elements; and that, at all times, both Clergy and those administering the chalice must adhere to strict hand hygiene and continue to use sanitiser.

I hope this all makes sense, and that we will be able to make a smooth transition in our communion practice. Obviously, we will also monitor the public health situation with regards to Covid 19 in North Norfolk, and at any time, if necessary, will be prepared to change what we do.

Merchant Navy Day — After the morning service on Sunday 3rd September, members of the congregation were delighted to be able to join Beeston Regis Parish Councillors and their guests in the churchyard to commemorate those who served in the Merchant Navy. The event was held to mark Merchant Navy Day, which became an official day of remembrance in 2000, and is intended to raise public awareness of the country's ongoing dependence on merchant seafarers.

The poignant and moving ceremony was introduced by Mike Knowles, Chairman of the Parish Council, and included a poetry reading, raising of the Red Ensign, and a prayer by the Revd. Jeremy Sykes. People in the Merchant Navy with local connections were remembered, together with those who served in the Sheringham Lifeboat, 'Foresters Centenary', between 1936 and 1961.

After the ceremony, refreshments were enjoyed together in the church. It is hoped that this event will be repeated in future years to mark a developing partnership between members of the church and the Parish Council.
