The thing about Easter is that it changes everything. And ultimately that is the core of the Christian message. 

His life was changed by his faith, leaving a potentially brilliant academic career to be a country parson. Despite his early death he left a rich legacy that continues to inspire people today.

Don't worry if you do not have a computer, hard copy Consent Forms will be made available in each of our Benefice churches.

FINANCES IN THE BENEFICE

We appreciate that times are tough for many people, especially with the abolition of the winter fuel allowance, but if you can review the amount you contribute to our churches in the Benefice on a regular basis it would be much appreciated.

There are several ways you can give—

- by BACS payment;
- by setting up a monthly or weekly Standing Order;
- by placing your money in the “Gift Aid” envelopes to be found on the church pews;
- by placing a donation in the collection plate; or
- by tapping the card machine.

If you pay tax then “Gift Aid” of 20% can be reclaimed on your donation.

Please speak to the Treasurer of your church who will be able to provide you with the relevant bank details.

Any increase in your giving, no matter how small, will be much appreciated.

DID YOU KNOW.....

That there is an Act of Parliament that regulates the date of Easter Day and days or other periods and occasions depending thereon? The Easter Act 1928 was a short Private Members' Bill which fixed Easter day as the first Sunday after the second Saturday in April. The Act applies to the whole of the UK, the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands. The Easter Act received Royal Assent on 3rd August 1928 but the central provision of the Act has never been brought into effect.

The answer to Jeremy's question "When did Good Friday fall on Boxing Day" is that it was in 1899 when a horse named Good Friday fell in a race at Wolverhampton on Boxing Day that year.

Sheringham & District Philatelic Society — Thirteen members gathered to welcome back Peter Boyce, from the Norfolk and Norwich Philatelic Society, to show us his Norwegian collection. He explained how, through his genealogical research, he found that his ancestors were Vikings, which is, of course, true for many of us! His display started with an 1827 postal cover and with examples of the first Norwegian stamps to be issued, in 1885, but which he believes to be fakes. The most frequently used emblem on Norwegian stamps, over 144 years, has been the Post Horn, produced in different colours and shades.

These have been interspersed with portraits of their Kings and Queens, and more recently with commemoratives e.g. Winter Olympics, and special issues e.g. natural history. During the German occupation in 1941, stamps were overprinted with a V to denote their victory over the Norwegians. Other items in the display were regional stamps, presumably only for use locally, and Peter had found it difficult to obtain any used specimens. He also showed Booklet stamps, various printings, Officials, Postage Dues and Miniature Sheets. We hope that Peter will be able to return next year to share yet another of his many collections with us.
