## HELLO FROM JEREMY

Dear Friends,

By the time you receive this month's newsletter we will have started the season of Advent, and the build up to Christmas.

Advent is the time of the year when in our services we look at the last things and the second coming of Jesus. But it is also like Lent, a time of preparation and reflection.

Reflection and preparation in readiness for a great event, the celebration of the Birth of Christ, the day when God took a great risk and became flesh and dwelt among us.

Too often Advent can get lost in the preparation and present buying and Christmas is upon us before we know it, and it's all too easy to forget just what Christmas is really about.

In many ways the thought of an Almighty and all powerful God, becoming human and being born as a tiny helpless baby in a mucky stable is something a little bit absurd.


But throughout the Bible there are stories of people who met God in unexpected ways and places – take Moses, looking after sheep on a mountainside, who encounters God in a bush; or Jacob fleeing from his brother's wrath sleeping on a stone pillow at the place renamed *Bethel* because from his dream there he had perceived it as the house (*beth*) of God (*el*).

So, on reflection, is it really surprising that God should manifest himself in a seemingly insignificant baby, born in a cave used for cattle; or that the baby's first visitors, should be shepherds, regarded as rogues whose word could not be trusted in a court of law? As we read the familiar Christmas stories and sing carols old and new, may they remind us that none of us is too "ordinary" to receive God, in Jesus, into our hearts and into our lives.

I wish you all, your families and friends, a very happy, Advent, Christmas and a blessed New Year, and look forward to seeing many of you at our various Advent and Christmas services, and I finish with a blessing for Christmas—

May the eagerness of the shepherds, the joy of the angels, the perseverance of the wise men, the obedience of Joseph and Mary, and the peace of the Christ-Child be yours this Christmas, and the Blessing of God almighty, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit be upon you and remain with you throughout the festive period.

## **INTERCESSIONS FOR THE PEOPLE AND ORGANISATIONS OF THE BENEFICE**

Included with this month's Newsletter is a booklet of Intercessions for the People and Organisations of the Benefice. It is a Daily Cycle of Prayer for the Benefice.

Why do we pray? To answer that question let us look at what the Bible says. In 1 Thessalonians 5: 17 it exhorts us to "Pray continually".

In a world filled with chaos, we pray because prayer is the antidote to anxiety.

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus".

Philippians 4: 6-7.

We pray because prayer alleviates our weariness.

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest".

Matthew 11: 28

Prayer deepens our relationship with God. Prayer brings us closer to Him. He created us with a need for connection, and prayer is connection. Praying is talking to the Lord, just like friends talk to each other and are brought closer together through their sharing. When we pray, we share our innermost being with Him. Through prayer, we are transformed and renewed. Prayer reminds us that we are dependent on God and not on ourselves. Prayer draws us closer to God.

We pray because God cares for us (1 Peter 5: 7). What a comfort to know God cares. He is interested in every detail of our lives. He wants us to involve Him in every aspect of our lives. He promises to listen, to help, and to protect. He promises to be there. When we pray, we surrender and release our thoughts, worries, and desires to God. We pray because prayer shifts our attention to "him who is able to do

immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us” (Ephesians 3: 20).

Do you have a need? A concern? God cares about you. Will you say a prayer to Him today?

Please pray for the following—

- For people to come forward to become Churchwardens at Aylmerton and at Beeston Regis
- For people to come forward to become members of the PCC
- For our church buildings that funds may be found for their urgent repair
- For our Christmas services across the Benefice that they will engage and connect with children in a special way and that the light of the Christ-child will be reflected in us to the families who come through our doors this Christmas

## **OPEN THE BOOK AT GRESHAM**

We are having discussions with Gresham School about resuming “Open the Book” with them. Open the Book (“OtB”) offers primary school children an opportunity to hear key Bible stories told by a team of Christians from local churches. Each presentation takes around 10–15 minutes and can be incorporated into a wider school assembly or can stand alone.

## **REGULAR GIVING & GIFT AID CLAIMS**

Here in the Quintet Benefice, we have suffered a loss of income due, partly, to a reduction in the amount put into the collection plate. Like everyone, we have also been hit by an increase in the costs for heating, lighting, etc. We are suffering serious financial difficulties.

Can we please ask everyone to consider increasing the amount that they give, no matter how small?

We are very grateful to all those church members who pay a regular amount by Standing Order and would strongly urge anyone who does not currently pay in this way to seriously consider doing so, as it helps with our forward planning.

If you are a UK taxpayer, please consider filling in a Gift Aid Form. The church can claim the tax you have paid back from HMRC – which is an extra 25p for every £1 you donate, or put another way, it increases your donation by 25% – that is so long as you have paid the basic rate of tax and make the donation from your own funds.

The church can also claim Gift Aid under the Small Donations Scheme for collections. Under these circumstances, please pay by cash, either in your envelopes or in not more than £20 notes, as we cannot claim Gift Aid under this scheme on cheques or large denomination notes.

If you require any further details, either about paying by Standing Order or about Gift Aid, then please speak to one of the Benefice Gift Aid Officers or one of the Treasurers.

In November we prayed regularly for God to raise up people with the right talents and energy to be involved in our forthcoming Ministry and Mission to children.

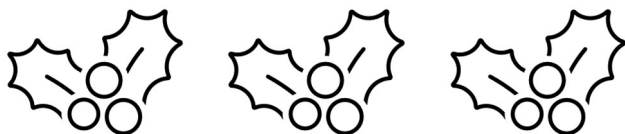

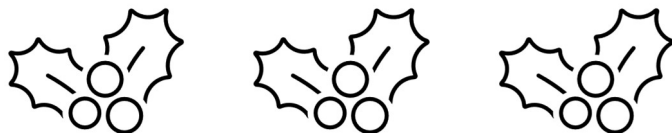
