HELLO FROM JEREMY

Dear Friends,

The Celebration of Christmas, New Year and Epiphany are over, and as I write this, we are fully into 2024. I hope you all enjoyed the celebrations and thank you to everyone who sent us cards and good wishes for the season. It was lovely to see so many people at church events over the Christmas period, and thank you to everyone who helped with services and to decorate our five churches.

But no sooner is Christmas over than our hopes for a bit of a lull to recharge our batteries and to recover are dashed, as in 2024 Easter is again very early. With Easter Sunday on the 31st March, this means that Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on Wednesday 14th February (St Valentine's day, who as well as being the patron saint of romance is also the patron saint of bee keepers!).

At our Ash Wednesday services ashes are used as a sign of our own mortality and as a sign of penance. This is an ancient custom when all present who wish to do so receive ashes on the forehead in the form of a cross and the priest says the words "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return."

Centuries ago it was the custom, at the beginning of Lent, to sprinkle ashes on public sinners as they came into the church in repentance. Now, we acknowledge publicly that we are all sinners and in need of repentance. Carrying the ashes on our forehead indicates our willingness to do penance for our sins. We are also reminded of our Lenten observance: "Turn away from sin and be faithful to the gospel."

The word Lent comes from the old Anglo Saxon word "Lencten" which means lengthening, and referred to the lengthening of the days in "spring" and particularly March, with March known as the Lencten month. As usually most of the days of fasting between Ash Wednesday and Good Friday fall in March, this period was known as the "Lencten Fast" or Lent.

The forty days of Lent correspond with the period of Christ's fast in the wilderness. However, if you add the days from Ash Wednesday to Easter Sunday you will see that it makes forty-six days! This is because we don't count Sundays in the forty days of Lent, because every Sunday is a celebration of Easter and the resurrection of Christ and is exempt from the Lenten observations. (So, if you have given them up for Lent, you are allowed a glass of wine or a piece of chocolate during the Sundays of Lent!)


Lent is a time of reconciliation. A time when we make space in our lives to think about our relationship with God and the ways in which we are responding or failing to respond to his love and care for us.

It's very easy to "lose" the real God in our world and in our life. It's easy to come to feel like a displaced person or a wandering soul in search of the meaning of life. The fact that we do wonder and we do question is a healthy sign. May you be able to use this Lent wisely and to deepen your relationship with God during this time.

As we did last year, I plan to hold a weekly Lent group at the Rectory which will mostly take place on a Thursday afternoon, at 2:30pm starting straight after Ash Wednesday on Thursday 15th February. This year we will follow a Lent course by Nicholas and Judith Calver, called "Exploring the Void" based on the film "Touching the Void".

BISHOP'S LENT APPEAL 2024

The Bishop's Lent Appeal 2024 will help to raise money to provide water tanks for Ordinand's Homes at Newton Theological College in Papua New Guinea. Due to the mountainous nature of Papua New Guinea all but very local travel is made by air and the limitations and expense of travel mean that students must live on-campus with their families. Family life is centred around the wind-house which is the coolest way to spend the day but sleeping accommodation and toilet facilities are provided in small chalets.

Bishop Graham writes:

"Your donations and fundraising will enable ordinands and their families to thrive, so supporting the next generation of Christian leaders in Papua New Guinea to have the best possible start with their training."

Most of the student houses at Newton College are in great need of refurbishment and nearly all need significant repair, but the primary need is to provide them with clean water from rainwater tanks and to reconnect toilets to septic tanks.

It will cost around PGK 2,000 (around £400) to install a water tank between every two student houses and the aim is to raise enough to provide twenty-five tanks between fifty student homes.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY

Our Quintet Benefice's small Open the Book Team has been greatly enjoying its delivery of assemblies to Gresham Village School twice every term. It has been rewarding to witness our relationship with the Headteacher and his staff community developing; and delightful that the children are so passionate and fervent in their contribution to our storytelling.

This short and lively act of collective worship, with a script from the Bible Society, Bible stories from the Lion Storyteller Bible and quiet time for reflection and all-inclusive prayer, is taken into schools all over the UK, and other countries as well, by groups of people from local churches.

This month we say “Goodbye” and “Thank You” to John Hodgkinson, a founding team member from Cromer church who was also a past Headteacher at the school. We are grateful for his helping us find our feet and boosting our numbers but now understand he has the Cromer schools to attend to.

Therefore, we are praying for and seeking new volunteer storytellers, linked to any of our 5 churches, to join our Quintet Benefice Open the Book team as soon as possible. A DBS check will be required for safeguarding adherence and this will be organised and funded by the Benefice for you.

The time commitment would be one 90 minute meeting per term for planning and praying for that term's assemblies plus 2 short afternoon assemblies per term with a rehearsal lasting 90 mins beforehand on each occasion. Transport to Sheringham and Gresham can be arranged for those without it.

There are no pre-requisites in terms of qualifications or experience. A passion for, and commitment to, sharing God's word with children is essential. Training is available to you, in person or online. We seek to embrace diversity and strive to be inclusive so do not be hindered from expressing interest if you have any disability. 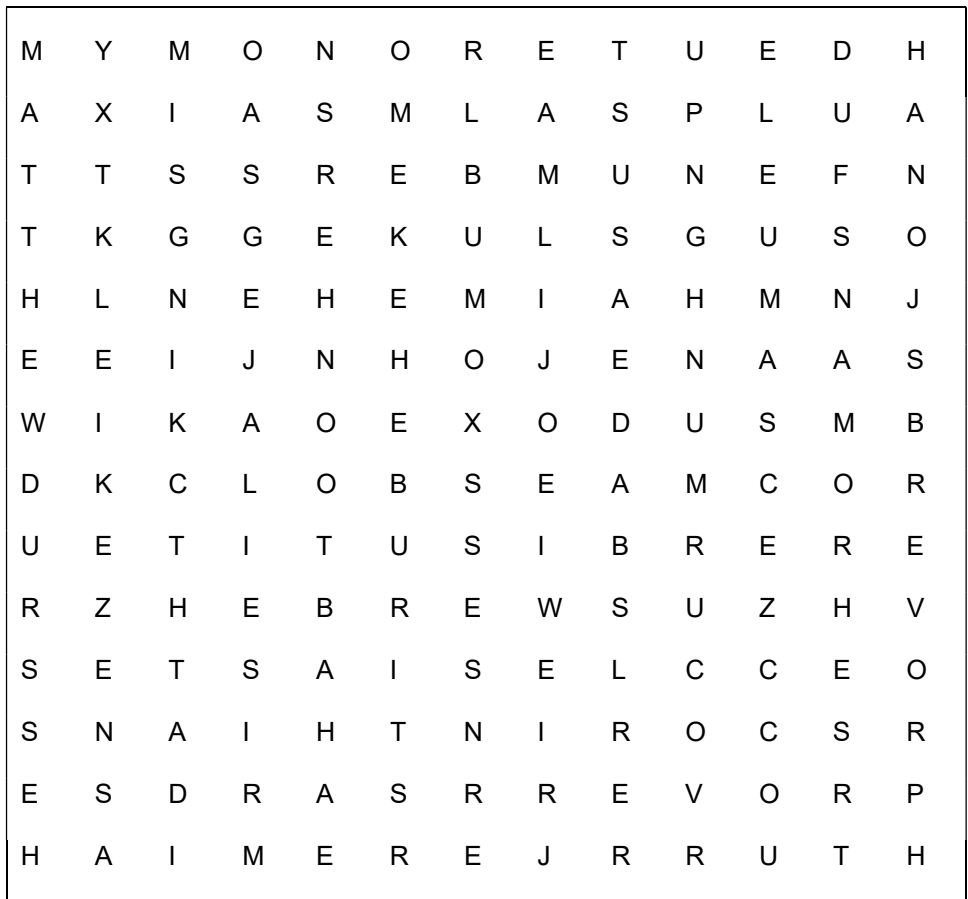
