## HELLO FROM REV PAUL YEOMANS

Dear Friends,

Around 600B.C. the prophet Habakkuk was concerned over the rampant sin, iniquity, and political corruption which was going unchecked in the land of Judah. He wanted to know why God was not doing anything about it. God informed Habakkuk that He planned to punish the iniquity of Judah very soon and that the instrument He would use was going to be the Chaldeans, a ruthless, aggressive, violent nation. This was not the answer he expected. He could not reconcile the problem of how God, in His righteousness and holiness, could use such a wicked instrument as the Chaldeans to chasten His chosen people Judah. God's reply to Habakkuk implied that the righteous, godly, person exercises a continuous and abiding confident trust in God even in the face of all adversity and trial, and in every circumstance of life. To Habakkuk, this meant that the just lived in faithfulness both in a time of spiritual declension, such as he was experiencing in Judah, and in a time of national calamity for which he was commissioned to prophesy.

These last few months we have all experienced very difficult times. There is the ongoing pandemic, economic problems with a cost-of-living rise, political turmoil, and various ongoing social problems along with the very real threat of a Third World War. We might well be tempted to also ask "What is God doing about it?" The answer will still be the same. As Christians, we are to trust that God is in charge of all that is happening and that everything is working for the eventual good "with those that love Him and are called according to His purpose" (Romans 8:28). Like so much in the Christian life, it comes back to Love. Fear is a lack of love. "Perfect Love casts out fear" (1 John 4:18).

In challenging times, it is especially important to exercise that trust, not only for our own spiritual well-being but also as a witness to the Gospel. Those who put their trust in worldly matters are rightly fearful, worried, and generally distressed when these things happen, but Christians placing their trust in a risen Saviour, focussed on the Cross, know with certainty that "all shall be well and all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well" (Mother Julian) a trust that transcends chaos and fear and finds a perfect Peace.

# MARATHON 2022

## ALL SAINTS CHURCH, BEESTON REGIS – MILE 10

After smashing his target of £26,000 and raising more than £38,000 for 26 local charities last year, Duncan Baker MP is aiming to do it all over again, but with a twist.

For every mile that Duncan completes, 25 local charities will each receive £1,000, and then for the final mile of the marathon, he wants to donate £5,000 to the Supporting Ukraine in Norfolk Community Foundation's Ukraine Fund that is helping refugees all over Norfolk. The target Duncan aims to raise this year is £30,000.

Forty charities were nominated by members of the public, and 26 charities were chosen in a live draw on Friday 1<sup>st</sup> July at the Holt Youth Project.

We are pleased to announce that All Saints Church, Beeston Regis has been successful in being one of the charities to be supported, being drawn as Mile 10.
